## **Objectives and activities**

The organisation's purposes are:

- The advancement and improvement of the area known as Ury Riverside Park, Inverurie
- Develop recreational facilities that are accessible
- Enhance the biodiversity and amenity of the area known as Ury Riverside Park, Inverurie
- To be open and inclusive to appropriate community events
- To do anything else deemed appropriate to meet the aims and objectives of the group.

The Charity's main activities and achievements in the last year has been:

- Installed two large Notice boards
- Continuation land maintenance. Including grass cutting, path edge weed control.
- Undertook regular liaison with Aberdeenshire Council staff and councillors
- Assisting the Aberdeenshire Council in the control of Giant Hogweed around the park including supporting a fencing and sheep grazing eradication programme in the densest area of GHW.
- Installed play equipment in the park. Donated by Barratts Homes Limited
- Coordinated the Inverurie Queens Canopy tree planting in the park and around Inverurie.
- Attended Groupfest (a public promotion of organisations in Inverurie Town Hall)
- Contributed to the NESCAN carbon mapping exercise for Aberdeenshire.
- Started to develop a biological monitoring programme for the park with external expert support and advice.
- Submitted biological survey data to NESBReC
- Revised the management plan for the park

- Met with Aberdeenshire Council paths and access team to plot new walking route across the park from the new Portstown bridge across the river Ury into the park.
- Undertook regular monthly litter picking programme
- Put up occasional signs to assist users around issues such as removal of dog mess, care around giant hogweed and care to control dogs during the bird nesting season.
- Volunteers and experts organised park Walks and Talks for interest groups from Inverurie and nearby towns and villages
- Worked on proposal to expand the park and buy another area of land in Inverurie. Contributed to the Inverurie Concept Masterplan covering expansion of land access along the Ury and around Inverurie.
- Met with staff from Paths for All and the Ian Findlay path fund to assess Active Travel routes through the park.
- Joined the Northwoods Rewilding Network
- Managed the planted woodland with the removal of tree guards from well-established trees and replaced dead saplings as required.
- Contributed to the Inverurie place-based development workshop programme (more in the coming years)

### **Financial review**

#### Statement of the charity's policy on reserves

The majority of the costs incurred by the SCIO have been provided by reserves held by Aberdeenshire council. At the start of the year there was an opening balance of £3378.52 and the closing balance was £6317.32. This is an increase of £2938.80 by the end of the year due, mainly, to funds transferred by Aberdeenshire council to purchase Maintenance equipment. The charity received several donations through Charity Aid Foundation, Amazon Smile.

## Future plans

In the next year the charity intends to:

- Build a granite entrance to the park from Oldmeldrum road subject to the necessary construction funding (the granite has already been acquired).
- Install drainage on the main tarmac path between the entrance and the bridge to prevent a build-up of water next to the path from running across the path.
- Make further efforts to continue the eradication of Giant Hogweed within the park programme with the INNS and Aberdeenshire council.
- Oversee plans for new footbridge bridge and connecting path through the park as part of the Meldrum Megway. Although utilising the park this programme is not managed by the charity, so timing is uncertain.
- Seek further funding for the extension of an all-abilities children's play area.
- Further develop funding for ongoing maintenance of the park.
- Maintain the park vegetation for the benefit of people and wildlife
- Undertake programme of regular on-site litter collection
- Seek to monitor park usage by the local community
- Pursue further opportunities for extensions to the park area
- Seek new trustees and more members from the community.
- Continue to support the very popular Ury Riverside Park run event.
