Litter bins are outside Lidl and Birch Drive (near footbridge entrance).

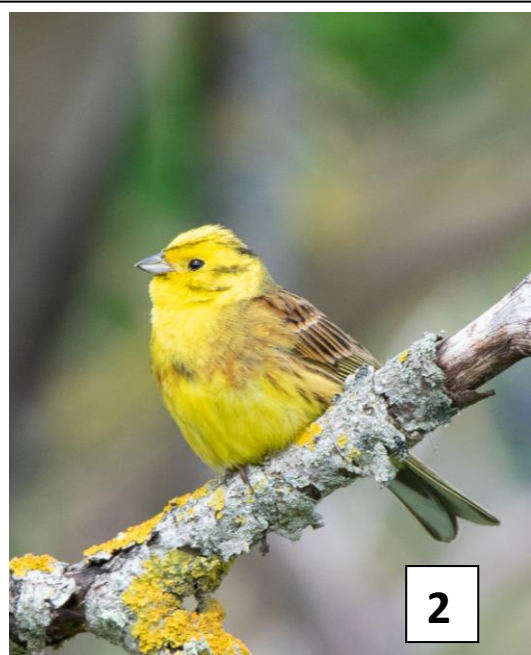

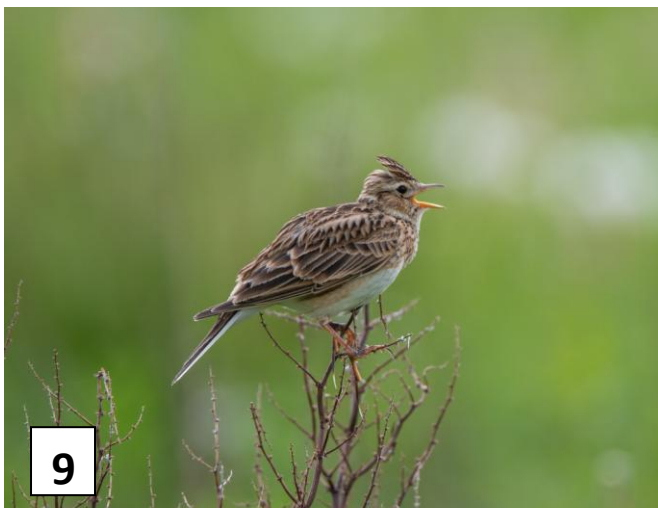
